

Neighbourhood Plan Consultation Event Nov 15

Comments received:

1. Education

There is potential overcrowding of schools, especially at Cledford side of town due to Warmingham Lane developments.

Post 16 education needed in Middlewich to avoid school transport costs.

Warmingham Lane developments are too far from Primary Schools - extra pressure on roads caused by parents taking children to school in cars.

Middlewich schools are considered to be of a very good standard but growing town will need more provision.

Health - we need a health centre AND a walk-in clinic and flexibility with appointments

Need after-school 'wraparound care' for over 8s.

Several people mentioned the need for some sort of Sixth Form provision in Middlewich.

Parking near schools is an issue.

There is considered to be good provision of nursery schooling/child care.

Need extra Primary School provision.

Post 16 education provision is a priority to avoid transport issues.

Education in basic skill sis needed 16 -21 NVQs etc.

2. Community Infrastructure

Desire for Sutton Lane Playing Field to remain an open space.

Swimming pool needed as we're surrounded by water and children being taken far afield for lessons.

There is good provision of childcare x 2.

A medical healthcare centre would be welcome - but not too big.

Potential overcrowding in all schools

Post 16 education should be a priority

Clearer appointment systems needed at GPs surgeries

More provision for elderly residents is a priority.

Day respite care provision is currently inadequate

More use could be made of pharmacies to avoid need for walk-in clinic
